Subject: Operating Authority Certificate

As of January 02, 2020, commercial vehicles that transport passengers are exempted from the requirement to hold an operating authority certificate and will no longer be required to produce it during a roadside inspection and/or when obtaining commercial passenger vehicle registrations.

You are receiving this letter because you are the holder of an operating authority certificate. Your certificate does not need to be renewed or re-issued.

Commercial vehicles exempted from the requirement to hold an operating authority certificate will still be required to:

- Hold the necessary certificate, such as a Safety Fitness Certificate;*
- Hold the necessary insurance to operate a passenger transportation vehicle;
- Hold a valid operator's licence of the class required to operate the particular passenger vehicle being driven;
- Pass a semi-annual Commercial Vehicle Inspection Program (CVIP) inspection and hold the appropriate decal;*
- Meet any other regulatory requirements regarding the operation of a commercial vehicle.

*Applies to vehicles registered in Alberta.

Permit Type: Semi-Annual Bus Inspection Exemption

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Registrar under the provision of Section 62 of the Traffic Safety Act and section 76 of the Vehicle Inspection Regulation. The holder of this permit is authorized to operate commercial buses within the province of Alberta for up to 12 months from the last inspection, as long as the bus has not traveled more than 15,000 km.

The permit holder is exempt from section 19(1)(d) of the Vehicle Inspection Regulation, AR 211/2006.

Conditions:

1. The permit holder shall ensure:
 - a) an inspection schedule is in place that would address all the items listed in the Commercial Vehicle Inspection Program, Inspection Methods and Standards Manual.
 - b) vehicle inspections under 1(a) are performed, and its results recorded and placed on vehicle *maintenance file*.
 - c) a written preventative maintenance program is in place which includes provisions for a driver pre-trip inspection and evidence of documented follow up where defects have been identified.
2. Every motor carrier shall retain the original permit at the carrier's principal place of business.
3. Every motor carrier shall maintain and have available for inspection, a listing of all equipment operated under this permit.
4. Every driver of a motor vehicle being driven under the conditions of this permit, shall carry a copy of the permit in the motor vehicle and shall produce such permit upon the request of any person designated as an inspector for such purposes. The driver must also produce the last commercial vehicle inspection certificate,

which indicates the odometer reading of the bus.

5. All collisions involving fatalities, serious injuries or property damage in excess of \$2,000 shall be reported to the Registrar within 24 hours of the incident, and all reporting to the Registrar must be made via e-mail to the Central Permit Office at central.permits@gov.ab.ca.
6. The Director, Permitting and Approvals, may amend, suspend or cancel this exemption at any time.
7. The onus is on the permit holder to renew the permit prior to the expiry date.
